

# 1967 Daimler Sovereign

- The UK patent rights to the Gottlieb Daimler's engine were purchased in 1893 by Frederick Simms, who formed a new company, the "Daimler Motor Syndicate".
- In 1896 Simms and Harry Lawson initiated car production in the city of Coventry as the "Daimler Motor Company".
- Daimler is known as Britain's oldest marque
- The Daimler Sovereign, a more luxury version of the Jaguar 420, was introduced in 1966.
- The Sovereign shares the same four-door monocoque body shell of the Jaguar and utilizes a traditional Daimler fluted radiator grille.
- It is equipped with all-round independent coil-spring suspension, disc brakes and a version of the Jaguar MKX's 4235cc DOHC straight-six engine.
- The Daimler Sovereign remained in production until 1969 by which time some 5,829 are thought to have been made.
- The 1967 Daimler Sovereign Saloon below belongs to Thomas Melville of Miamisburg, Ohio.
